Crime Reduction Unit

On April 25th, Codiac Crime Reduction Unit and Codiac Integrated Enforcement Unit started an investigation on a target after receiving information that he was trafficking drugs.

On 2023-05-02, Codiac Crime Reduction Unit members with Codiac Integrated Enforcement Unit and Codiac Patrol executed a search warrant on Mill Road, Moncton, New Brunswick. One male was arrested

Items located during the search included:

- A loaded 9 mm hand gun (3D printed)
- Ammunition
- Cash
- Large quantity of cocaine
- Various hydromorphone pills

On May 11th, Codiac Crime Reduction Unit and Codiac Integrated Enforcement Unit executed a search warrant at a residence in Riverview. Two people were arrested

Items located during the search included:

- Methamphetamine pills
- Crystal methamphetamine
- Cocaine
- Hydromorphone pills
- Cash
- A 9mm handgun
- A stolen motorcycle
- A stolen E-Bike and various stolen tools. The E-Bike was returned to its owner who is from Moncton.

During the execution of a Search Warrant, a male arrived on scene with a bag containing various tools. Further investigation into the bag determined that it had been stolen from a local business overnight and had not been reported yet.

Assistance given to Peel Regional Police in the apprehension of two suspects who were in the Moncton area, who were wanted for a homicide committed in Mississauga, ON

The PCRU, assisted by Codiac RCMP intercepted individuals on May 31st in Salisbury. Following the arrest and then two subsequent search warrants executed in both Moncton and Dieppe, a total of 3 people were arrested. During the combined searches, over 10 kilograms of illegal drugs were seized, as well as a very large quantity of cash. The drugs were destined for residences in the Greater Moncton area and were meant for sale on our streets. As an estimate, 10 kilograms of drugs is equal to between 50,000 and 100,000 individual portions or as they are called on the street “hits”.

General Investigation Section/Major Crime Unit

Continue work on the most complex and time-consuming files.

Update on a stabbing incident which occurred in December of 2022 at Fairview Knoll.

- 1 of 3 accused (adult) plead guilty last week in the attempted murder file. Sentence scheduled for June 26th;
- 2nd accused (youth) plead guilty early April and scheduled for sentencing on May 29th;
- 3rd accused (youth) is scheduled for plea on May 3rd.

One of Codiac's dangerous offenders, a 35-year-old man, was recently sentenced on April 20th for a stabbing which occurred on October 8th 2022 on St-George Street. He remains incarcerated as other charges are pending for another Moncton stabbing.

We have three GIS members and two members from our Further Investigative Team being trained on Forensic Child Interviewing. This will really help with the service delivery to our child victims.

Patrol

On the weekend of April 21-23, an event was held at the Coliseum titled Radical Speedsport. Hundreds of vehicles were located at the Coliseum, where drivers performed burnouts in the parking lot. Members remained on scene, however crowd did not dissipate until we called some tow trucks. The vehicles then attended Caledonia Industrial Park and did some more burnouts and races until we broke it up. Multiple reports throughout night of cars gathering in the large parking lots for similar activities.

- 3 impaired drivers
- 1 collision vs pedestrian – hit and run

We had no advance notice on this event. For planning purposes, it would be ideal if we were made aware ahead of time. City Manager

On April 23rd one of the Patrol teams decided to execute a Warrant of Arrest Roundup – 16 Warrants executed. This was a great demonstration of proactive work.

During the night of April 29, we received a complaint of a suspicious vehicle near a gas station in Riverview and reported as a possible break and enter in progress. Members attended and located a vehicle with an enclosed trailer leaving the site. Members intercepted the vehicle safely before it reached the exit. Two occupants were detained. Investigation revealed that the male and female suspects were in fact pumping diesel out of the wheel loaders at a construction site. Both were arrested for possession of stolen property and Theft. Their trailer was equipped with electric pumps and steel water tanks. The trailer that they were using was also stolen. We believe that the two have been stealing fuel at various construction sites around the Greater Moncton area. Both are facing charges.

On Friday May 19th, a large group of members participated in the Royal Visit. HRH Anne Princes Royal paid her respects to the three fallen members and their families who were all in attendance.

April Operation

On Friday April 28th, the Provincial Tactical Traffic Enforcement Team was in the Greater Moncton area and partnered with Codiac RCMP members. Targeted traffic enforcement at various critical areas.

Recognition events

On April 28th, a Divisional Awards Ceremony was held in Moncton, celebrating the accomplishments of RCMP employees from across the province. During the ceremony ten Codiac members were awarded various awards, including:

- Five members were awarded long service medals for 20 years of exemplary service
- Three members were awarded the Saint John's Ambulance Life Saving Award and Commanding Officer's Commendation, for saving an injured client who had suffered a gunshot wound in Moncton
- One member was awarded a Commanding Officer's Commendation for Bravery, after

saving the life of an elderly female by carrying her out of a burning building in Riverview -One member was awarded a Commanding Officer's Commendation for saving the life of a man in medical distress in Shediac (while the member was working there at the time).

The awards were presented by the New Brunswick Lieutenant Governor.

On May 23rd, three Codiac members were awarded the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Medal in Fredericton. The medals were presented to the members for their advancement of priorities and commitment to New Brunswickers. They were presented to members by the New Brunswick Lieutenant Governor.

B. Major Issues/Risks Since Last Report

In the early morning of May 15th, Codiac members were called to a residence on Lutz Street. Following the arrival of members on scene, they were presented by an armed suspect who did not cooperate with police commands. Various intervention options were used, including one member's firearm to stop the threat. Following the incident, a male was transported to hospital for treatment. No members were injured during the incident. Following an incident, the Serious Incident Response Team (SIRT) out of Nova Scotia was contacted and deployed to the scene. They have taken ownership of the investigation into the matter.

C. Stakeholder/Community Consultations

Community Policing has continued regular engagement with various community stakeholders on a daily basis. Weekly social issues meetings taken every Tuesday with all community partners, to discuss on-going trends and issues, such as homelessness.
